### Joys and Concerns: Striking a Balance

At a recent Wednesday evening Lenten gathering Pearl Lenzen made an important observation. She noted that in our prayers we tend to focus on our problems and concerns, but we often forget to offer thanks for our many blessings. As we move forward as a church we have any number of concerns and our prayers should absolutely address them, but to dwell on those concerns to the exclusion of our blessings would be a mistake.

We may not always know who will lead our worship on any particular future Sunday, but we are so fortunate that Reverend Rosanna Walker will lead us on two of the most important days in the church calendar (Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday). We are grateful that Allen Gislason has agreed to lead our services on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of every month for the foreseeable future. We are fortunate to have found Karen Moe, our new (returning) church secretary, who has so enthusiastically embraced the position. We are fortunate to have dedicated church members who are willing to serve in so many ways to keep this church operating from Sunday to Sunday. Because of these generous contributions of talent and time, God is still speaking in our church.

Sunday services play an important role in cementing our community of faith, but the church is much more than the Sunday ritual. The church is ultimately about doing the work that God has called us to do and we do a lot more than just keep our doors open from Sunday to Sunday. God is still speaking in our church and we are listening. In 2017 our small congregation committed over eight thousand dollars to address areas of need beyond our church doors. That work continues. The church council just recently committed twelve hundred dollars of the meatball dinner proceeds to address areas of need within our own community. We may be a small church, but we are a generous church, and we should all feel fortunate to be part of it.
