The Pastor's Quarter

Greetings, Granite Falls UCC members,

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. (It is hard to top Paul in his letters to Timothy when it comes to an opening greeting.)

Thank you for the opportunity to write an article for the Pastor's Corner (or whatever it is called these days). I used to write these on a regular basis back in the 2003-2006 era. That (2003-2006) is easy to write but hard to believe. I have mostly fond memories of my time as the Interim Minister at GFUCC. As I recall, Dick Andersson came up with the title of Person of Enhanced Pulpit Supply. I added "Inc" to it to make me the PEPSI person.

Jane and I first started coming to the UCC church in 1991 when Pastor Rosanna was there. [Side note: we named all our goats after her because she and they were so sweet.] I served on the Council for a number of years, some of those as Clerk. At one point, we even took over as the organizers of the famous Meatball Dinner. I believe it was Judd Copeland who persuaded us to take on that enviable task.

All of this history is a way of saying that I'm happy to be back preaching among you awesome folks. I can't think of another congregation of people for whom I would do this on an ongoing arrangement. Many of you know that I love getting into the Bible, researching topics, and then talking about the Lord. Thank you for being so supportive and welcoming.

Speaking of the Bible, I hope some of you will become more comfortable with asking questions about whatever passage I am discussing on any given Sunday. I am going to try using ¼ sheets of paper for submitting questions. Why do I want to do this? Mainly because that is the way it was done in the time of Jesus, Paul, and the other apostles. Any town that had ten Jewish men could, and usually would, start a synagogue. Often Jesus or Paul or others would go to the synagogue where the scripture scroll would be unrolled to a particular passage. After the rabbi (or a visiting teacher) spoke on that passage, there would be discussion among those present. Often you could find Gentile converts in the audience. People would go away from these presentations/discussions with a better idea of what God wanted them to do on a day-to-day basis. They learned how to live in a relationship with God. This is not what we western churchgoers grew up with, but, hey, who says we cannot learn new things? Try it; you may like it. By no means will I have answers to all questions or observations. But that's okay. Sometimes it just helps to know that others are thinking the same or similar thoughts as you.
